Description

Trumpeter and Edison winner **Teus Nobel** brings his quartet to Rotterdam with **Child's Play**, described here as his most personal album yet. The music was shaped during a period when his family was dealing with serious illness, and while resilience and pragmatism were needed at home, Nobel found inspiration in the way children play: free, unpredictable, and full of imagination. That spirit runs through the compositions, where spontaneity and a kind of “controlled chaos” sit in balance with structure, much like the logic of a game.

For this project, Nobel formed a tight, all-star line-up with guitarist **Teis Semey**, bassist **Jasper Høiby**, and drummer **Niek de Bruijn**, bringing the album's mix of precision and openness to the stage.

Before the concert, there's also a documentary screening. At **19:00**, the film **Human First** is shown (around 50 minutes), with **free entry**, but you're asked to reserve a free ticket so the venue knows you're coming. The documentary, made by British filmmakers **Simon Sixsmith** and **Steve Denniss**, follows Teus and his wife as they make space for creativity again after an intense period, tracing the process that led to Child's Play and setting the context for the live performance.
