Description

Momoko Gill comes to BIRD with a live show that moves far beyond the idea of a standard concert. The London-based artist brings together jazz, electronica, spoken word, improvisation and forward-thinking soul, creating performances that feel raw, hypnotic and emotionally charged.

Gill moves between South London's underground jazz scene and the electronic worlds of artists such as Matthew Herbert, Tirzah, Coby Sey and Alabaster DePlume. As a drummer, producer, composer and vocalist, she builds music that deliberately rubs against genre borders, finding its spark in the friction.

With her project Herbert & Momoko, she has previously appeared at festivals and venues including Dekmantel, Rewire, Sónar and Bimhuis in Amsterdam. Now Rotterdam gets the chance to experience her own work up close in the intimate setting of BIRD.

Fans of **Tirzah**, **Yussef Dayes**, **Little Simz**, **SAULT**, **Nala Sinephro** and **Alabaster DePlume** should keep this one firmly on the radar. Expect no safe setlist, no routine, but an artist working fully in the moment.
